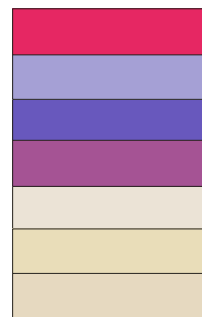
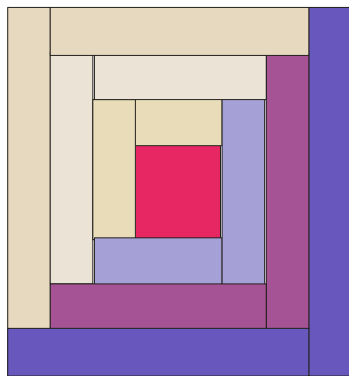


## Weekend Whatever #23 - Part 3

I know you all know how to make this block...a Log Cabin. I also know that there are many different ways to make this block. You have 2 ways to put the blocks together...(1) you can cut the units that I've specified and add them as they are required, or (2) you can place the pieced units onto a strip, leaving them about 1/4" apart. I don't believe either way is any quicker, or better, than the other. I think it's going to be a personal choice. I will not be giving pressing notes because you should **always** press toward the strip just added. This will keep you from pressing any seams once they have been pressed...you'll see what I mean when you start. You will be making **24 blocks for the Medium Size**, and **40 blocks for the Large Size**. **All blocks are to be squared up to 6-1/2"**.

### Sewing Instructions

Step	Directions
1	Attach the 24(40) 2" squares of Color C to a 1-1/4" strip of Bkg#3 or Unit#1 from below. If you attached to a strip, cut apart before pressing.
2-12	When you look at the completed unit, the newest strip should be on the right...then you add the next strip to the top. You will always be adding in a counter-clockwise direction. Following the chart and graphic below...add the rest of the strips in order. Please take the time to press after each new unit is added as it will be easier to keep your block sized right.
